Students were asked to complete a list of 100 words, with some students showing great motivation by finishing it for homework. We have also been focusing on vowels.


In numeracy, we spent some time looking at all the different ways we can make the number 100. We also had fun making a class clock for our new topic, measurement.

POWERING FUTURE INDUSTRIES












Over the last few weeks, students have been learning all about Chemical Sciences. Students have learnt that solids, liquids and gases are all made up of matter, and that matter can be changed when they are mixed with other materials or when they are heated. Cooking is all about these chemical changes. When we mix different materials together, we create a new material. Sometimes these changes are reversible and at other times these changes are irreversible. An example of this is when we mix salt with water. If we increase the temperature, the water will evaporate leaving the salt behind. This is a reversible change. Alternatively, when we mix flour, oats sugar and other ingredients to make ANZAC biscuits, when they cool down, they do not go back to their original state. This is called an irreversible change. In our next newsletter, we will be talking about National Science Week. This happens in week 6 and this year's theme is "Innovation - Powering Future Industries". To celebrate Science week, we will have special classes and experiments.










