#### Notes FROM THE PRINCIPAL:

Our morning school bell rings at 8:50 to allow students to settle into their classrooms for learning to begin at 9am. Please ensure your child does not arrive at school before 8:30am— unless they attend the Breakfast Program.

Our daily Breakfast Program runs from 8:20-8:40am each morning. Attendance is taken at 9:00am and students not present by 9:15am will be marked absent. A call will be made home if your child is absent during roll call to ensure they are safe.

Fruit/ Veggie/ Brain break is at 10am. Please ensure your child has something healthy to nibble on. Snack is at 10:45am. All students will eat their snacks before heading outside for recess.

Recess is from 11:00-11:30am. Two teachers are on duty at all times.

Lunch is eaten in the classroom at 1pm followed by recess play from 1:15-1:45. Mindfulness takes place from 1:45-2:00pm.

Dismissal for ANPS students is at 3:15.

Each Monday afternoon, Respectful Relationships is taught across our school. Our whole school Assembly will be each fortnight beginning at 2:30 pm. Our first assembly will be Monday, 20 Feb. All are welcome to attend.

We are planning to provide a **hot lunch program** this term. More info will be sent home regarding hot lunch dates, menu, and prices.

Icy poles will be for sale every Tuesday and Thursday, in Term 1. The cost is \$1.00.

Plans are also underway for a FAMILY WELCOME PICNIC. We hope to see everyone there! We will send out information regarding the Welcome Picnic date and time, next week.

- maintaining the school's grounds and facilities

- creating interest in the school in the wider community
- taking into account the views of the community
- regulating and facilitating the after hours use of school and grounds
- operating a children's service at the school or other premises controlled by the Minister
