
FROM OUR CLASSROOMS!

LEARNING AREA 1

In L.A. 1 the Grade 2 students have been learning the basic functions of a calculator to add 2s, 3s, and 5s, to see if a number pattern emerges. Meanwhile, the Grade 1 students have been reading The Ugly Duckling and responding to a writing prompt: "who is your favourite character in this story, and why?"

And of course our Prep students are doing well as they continue to learn the routines of daily school life and make new friends.





LEARNING AREA 2

In Geography, LA2 students are learning to name the States/Territories and Capital Cities of Australia. They are learning to use an Atlas effectively to research special features in each State/Territory.

DASH program delivers at Ararat North Primary School This term we are very lucky to have the DASH program being taught at our school. The DASH program is about developing youth voice, local partnerships, and collective action to build social recovery. adopts an inquiry-based learning approach through fun and interactive activities with grade 5 & 6 students. Students define their community, learn about their values, and design a project that acts on a local problem they identify. The DASH project at Ararat North Primary School is led by Cindy O'Sullivan along with Emergency Services and local community groups who come along to class and share their knowledge. Kristy McMahon (Ambulance Victoria) who attended Ararat North Primary School and Jack Main (Vic Police) attended session one and later in the term Gaby Hutchinson (East Grampians Health) will join us also. students have explored their community, their values, and their strengths. At the end of the 8 week program, students will present a 'Showcase of Ideas' showing the projects for positive change students they would like to see in the local community. \$2000 will go towards funding one of the projects.

On Wednesday 1st March at the Family Fun Night, Cindy O'Sullivan and some of the students will present an overview of the DASH program for parents and friends, some of the achievements of the Ararat North students, and talk about the project students are beginning to design. 

Science Update!

In Science this term, students have been studying **Biology**. **Learning Area 3** have been learning about **DNA**, the important role of **photosynthesis** and how humans have **adapted** over time. **Learning Area 2** have been learning about **living things** and the **four functions** all living things do. These four functions include: growing & changing, needing energy (eating/drinking), reproducing and responding to changes in the environment. **Learning Area 1** have been learning about the **features of living things**. For example, a fish has scales, a cat has fur, a frog has skin and a bird has feathers.

At the end of each lesson students have been going out into the vegetable garden and watering the plants. The plants have struggled with the hot weather but as you can see from the photos, we have tomatoes, pears and other vegetables nearly ready to be eaten!! 

- taking into account the views of the community
- regulating and facilitating the after hours use of school and grounds
- operating a children's service at the school or other premises controlled by the Minister
