Students have focussed on what sound the letter makes, what words have that letter sound at the start and matching pictures to the letters by sounding the word out. LA1 reads books daily and have been concentrating on learning new vocabulary from the books read to them in class.

On Wednesday, LA1 students invited some of the special people in their lives to join them for a morning of fun. Thank-you to all who came to support .




News from Learning Area 2




This week the students have been exploring a foundational concept of Linear Perspective.











News from Learning Area 3

LA3 students have recently completed their studies of Blueback, a wonderful story about a boy and his best friend, a Western Blue Groper. This tale is set against the backdrop of the Western Australian beaches, making for some rich discussions linked to history, geography, and numeracy. The students have completed a book review to conclude their studies of this story. Up next, the class will be reading and delving into Bridge to Terabithia by Katherine Paterson. Students are welcome to take their novels home to read.

Meanwhile, I have been extremely pleased with our results in Numeracy, for both Place Value and Factors. We are currently exploring Decimals, so if you are at the supermarket with your young person, this is a good opportunity to do some mental maths and add some decimal numbers.

Finally, last week our prospective Grade 6 leaders commenced the selection process. Grade 6 students were given the opportunity to self-nominate and present a speech to the ANPS community about why we should vote for them. More to come on this soon, so stay posted!

Play Based Learning

Students from Learning Area 1 have settled well into their Play Based Learning program. Whilst having huge amounts of fun the students have been working on collaboration, sharing, creating, trying new things and using their imaginations. All children have also started their Play Journals which will be a written and photographic record of their learning experiences and link literacy learning to their work in Play.





Physical Education

Last week Learning Area 3 started Newcomb for the first time. Newcomb is very similar to Volleyball, however the skills are a little easier to master. The aim is to hit the ball over the net into the opposition's space and try to get the ball to hit the ground before the opposition can catch and return it. The students practiced throwing the ball over the net to a partner and then moved on to serving the ball. When serving the ball to start play, the ball is thrown over the net not hit over like Volleyball. The action is a little like throwing a discus. The ball is thrown around the body.



How to book Parent Teacher Interviews using the Family App


This article is for parents/carers wishing to book Parent Teacher Interview slots for their children using the XUNO Family App.

XUNO allows you to book times for Parent Teacher Interviews with your children's teachers and/or coordinators. You can easily see the available times for each teacher, and select the times to suit your schedule. XUNO's Autobook feature will work out the best times for most of your bookings, which can make the process a breeze if you need to book with multiple teachers.


How to book your children's Parent Teacher Interviews

Option 1: Book times for each child's teacher or coordinator individually


1. Tap the three horizontal lines at the top left of your XUNO Family App screen, then scroll down and select **Parent Teacher**Interviews from the menu.




- 2. You will see the teachers or coordinators your child can book a Parent Teacher Interview in the bottom half of the screen. If you have more than one child at the school, one will be highlighted when you first enter the Parent Teacher Interviews screen. You can easily switch between each child by tapping on their name.
- 3. Note that your school may have slightly different options available, depending on whether or not Translators or Online interviews are available.
- 4. Tap the **Select a time** dropdown menu to choose a time slot that suits you for this teacher.



- 5. If your school has enabled comments, tap in the **Comments** text box and enter your message to the teacher or coordinator.
- 6. Tap the **Book** button as shown below to save this booking.



- 7. Repeat the above steps to complete all required bookings for all your children. XUNO will update the available times for each teacher as you save your bookings, so that you cannot double-book yourself with two teachers at one time.
- 8. You will see your confirmed appointments at the top of the screen after they are booked. If you need to cancel a booking, use the X icon to delete it.
